



Writing Barn Rules

While enjoying yourself at The Writing Barn's rustic retreat space, please observe ALL of the following for your safety and well-being:

DO

- DO use bug spray whenever walking, sitting or enjoying the porches, courtyard, or main paths. Texas is known for its insects: chiggers, mosquitoes, ticks, fleas, etc. (Bug spray is at various locations. Use liberally if enjoying the outdoors or any of the porches.)
- DO use the designated blue recycling bins.
- DO take pictures of the Writing Barn deer and wildflowers (please tag us on our social media accounts: Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram!).
- DO wear closed toed shoes when out walking, jogging, etc.
- DO use the yoga mats on the porches or indoors—but remember to use bug spray.
- DO use one of the small flashlights or electric lanterns in each building OR a flashlight app when walking at night. The property gets quite dark.
- DO write in your bedside guestbook. We'd love to hear about your stay.

DO NOT

- DO NOT walk off main paths into high grass areas. Texas is known for its snakes and other pests.
- DO NOT park in areas not designated as parking areas. There is adequate parking by The Writing Barn, Book House and Cabin as well as behind the Book House and Cabin if need be.
- DO NOT pick the wildflowers. They are for all to enjoy.
- DO NOT try to get close to the deer or pet them.
- DO NOT sign the “party porch” unless you are a traditionally published author who is asked to sign by WB personnel.
- DO NOT use fire pits unless cleared by the WB owners.
